

REACH Compliance Declaration

Regulation (EC) No 1907/2006

Status: 27 August 2026

Pursuant to Article 33(1) of Regulation (EC) No 1907/2006 of the European Union concerning the Registration, Evaluation, Authorisation and Restriction of Chemicals (REACH), our suppliers are required to inform us about certain substances contained in products manufactured or imported into the Member States.

The European Chemicals Agency (ECHA) regularly updates and publishes the Candidate List of Substances of Very High Concern (SVHC). Our manufacturing plants fulfil their obligations and carry out the corresponding identification and verification processes.

As part of these ongoing verifications, we can confirm that none of the substances included in the respective current Candidate List are contained in our products in concentrations exceeding **0.1% by weight**.

As stated above, our manufacturing plants are required to regularly review the products and the materials used in their manufacture against the substances included in the Candidate List in accordance with the requirements of the REACH Regulation.

Should our manufacturing plants determine that any of their products or the materials used in their manufacture are subject to information requirements, we will be informed accordingly without further request. We will, of course, comply with these obligations and inform our customers promptly and in accordance with the applicable regulatory requirements.

We hereby confirm that the products supplied by us comply with the applicable requirements of **Regulation (EC) No 1907/2006 (REACH)**.

Articles

Contrary to previous practice, cast billets and plates are considered substances or, in the case of alloys, mixtures. Semi finished products manufactured from these materials are considered articles in accordance with the ECHA *Guidance on Requirements for Substances in Articles*, Version 2, April 2011.

Articles made of copper and copper alloys do not fall within the scope of Regulation (EC) No 1272/2008 of the European Parliament and of the Council on the Classification, Labelling and Packaging of substances and mixtures (CLP Regulation) and are therefore not subject to classification and labelling requirements under that Regulation.
